#### Foreword from Professor Stephen Wigmore

As we are all acutely aware, the first quarter of 2020 has seen changes to every



aspect of University and NHS life in ways we could not have possibly imagined at the beginning of the year. As a department involved in frontline healthcare provision, academic research, and student education these changes will have far reaching consequences for all of us.

Please continue to check the University's Covid-19 webpages for the latest advice which is updated on a daily basis (<a href="http://edin.ac/covid-19">http://edin.ac/covid-19</a>).

The University has currently halted recruitment to all clinical trials which

will cause an inevitable delay to many of our studies and there will likely be consequences for grant provision as the funding landscapes changes in response to the Covid19 pandemic. However, at times of medical emergency research is needed more then ever to gather the evidence needed to accurately define the outbreak and develop new treatments.

Rapid response research across the University is already underway, including involving members of Clinical Surgery - Ewen Harrison's Surgical Informatics team is working with colleagues in the Usher Institute and around the country on the UK wide effort to define the clinical characteristics of Covid19 and provide live data reports being used by SAGE (Scientific Advisory Group) and NERVTAG (New and Emerging Respiratory Virus Threats) to inform government policy. Funders are also responding to the outbreak and are prioritising funding calls for Covid19 research (for further information see page 4 of this newsletter).

This quarter's edition of our regular newsletter will be a slimmed down version, reporting grants and papers achieved in the main before the sweeping changes brought in during March.

There is no doubt the months ahead will be challenging for all of us as we adapt to the realities of this worldwide pandemic. I'd like to thank you all on behalf of the Department of Clinical Surgery for all your efforts in the response whatever role you are playing.
