Professor Steve Yule is an academic psychologist with 20 years' experience studying team performance and non-technical skills in high risk/ high reliability industries including surgery, healthcare, energy, transportation, space exploration. Steve joined the Department of Clinical Surgery in 2020 from Harvard Medical School.

Here he talks to newsletter editor, Dr Katie Shaw, about his arrival in Edinburgh and current research plans.

Welcome to the Department of Clinical Surgery – can you introduce yourself and tell us about your time in Harvard?

Thanks for the warm welcome – it is exciting to be here! I had a great time in the US and worked at Harvard for 8 years and it is great to be back home. My wife, Jen is also an academic and on faculty at Edinburgh University Business School. We have actually published some work on patient perceptions of non-technical skills and survived it! We have 2 young boys who love the outdoors and I am looking forward to introducing them to Scottish culture, especially rugby!

How do non-technical skills relate to surgeons and surgery?

Non-technical skills are factors such as situation awareness, decision making, teamwork, leadership, and communication that we know impact surgical performance and patient safety. You can get better at these skills with training, deliberate practice and coaching in the operating theatre and simulation. I was really lucky to be involved earlier in my career in developing the NOTSS assessment tool and training course which focuses on non-technical skills for surgeons and is now used around the world for surgical education, assessment and research. The Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh has been a great advocate for this work.

What is Surgical Sabermetrics?

Surgical sabermetrics is a new field we are establishing which utilizes sensors and digitally recorded surgical training and operative procedures to objectively measure non-technical skills and other 'intangibles' like cognitive load, situation awareness, and trust. Having objective performance data from sensors and video could enhance insight, support professional development, and optimize clinical and safety outcomes. The term comes from SABR (Society of Advanced Baseball Research) which is a whole science dedicated to optimizing performance in baseball. I think we can put those principles to work in surgery.

What research projects are you establishing in Edinburgh?

The aim of the Surgical Sabermetrics Research Group is to develop and implement tools to objectively and automatically measure performance in the operating theatre. We have a number of exciting projects on video-based coaching, measuring cognitive load in surgical teams, developing digital human factors training, understanding cognitive bias in cancer MDTs, and applying artificial intelligence to measure quality of care in cardiac surgery. We are also interested in how resource level impacts the performance of teams in diverse settings from operating theatres in sub-Saharan Africa to and astronaut crews preparing for mission to Mars. I'm excited to work with new fellows Eilidh Gunn, Fiona Kerray and Emma Howie on these projects – and to collaborate with members of the department including Richard Skipworth, Andrew Tambyraja, Stephen Wigmore, Tom Weiser, and Ewen Harrison. There is a lot of opportunity and I am looking forward to meeting and working with more members of the department as we emerge from the global pandemic.

The Surgical Coaching for Operative Performance Enhancement (SCOPE) project sounds really interesting – is this something you hope to develop here in Scotland?

I think all surgeons deserve access to a coach to help achieve their aims to be better at technical skills, decision making, using new technology, whatever. It seems that all high performing professionals work with coaches to keep them at the top of the game; athletes and musicians rely on them to be better than yesterday, so why not surgeons? We developed a program for intraoperative peer coaching in surgery and involved over 50 Harvard surgeons - we found that surgeons could be trained to be coaches. Surprisingly for me the majority of surgeons wanted to focus on their non-technical skills including communication, teaching, dealing with conflict, and leadership. Eilidh Gunn is studying for a PhD with me in this area and has some great ideas on how we could implement coaching this side of the Atlantic.

We've never had a Space researcher in the department before! Can you tell us about this?



I have always been fascinated by humans in extreme environments so the chance to study astronaut crews and work with NASA was irresistible. We managed to get some research grants from NASA and other space agencies to build a space medicine simulator

in Boston, based on the Destiny module of the International Space station, and used it to study non-technical skills, autonomy, and telecommunications during simulated medical events in space.



We are currently creating an immersive virtual version of the simulations using holographic technology so astronauts can train for potential medical event management in flight to the Moon or Mars via a headset. My only regret is not calling our non-technical skills assessment tool 'ASTRONOTSS'!I was surprised that Edinburgh has a lively space research community and it will be great to continue that work here.

As well as research into non-technical skills field, Steve is also Programme Director for the MSc Patient Safety and Human Clinical factor launched as part of the Edinburgh Surgery Online programmes in 2018.

The MSc is crucial part of Edinburgh's reputation as a centre of excellence in non-technical skills and Human Factors – it is a 3 year programme with 2 years of online education and a full year to work on research or QI project. Students come from a mix of clinical and non-clinical backgrounds - the first class just graduated this summer which we are really proud of and there are now around 75 students enrolled. Dr Domenica Coxon is the deputy programme director and we just received accreditation

from the Chartered Institute for Ergonomics and Human Factors in the UK. This really is the vision of Simon Paterson-Brown, Nikki Maran, James Garden, and Tom Weiser – and it is exciting to see the programme take off.

It must have been strange arriving in Edinburgh just before the Covid19 lockdowns were imposed – what has been the biggest challenge for you during this time

We landed in Edinburgh and had a baby in late February 2020 so recent life has been a bit of a blur..

Annual Research Report 2021




When I wrote the research report for the department newsletter last year it was rather in the hope that COVID would have subsided and things would be getting back to normal. Sadly that has not been the case and we are currently facing a new surge in cases and the prospect of further disruption to research work. Thankfully the research institutes did reopen earlier in the year and a "new normal" for laboratory research has been established in the institutes although many activities remain restricted. The department (excluding the Western General Hospital groups) has published 195 papers this year. The median impact factor of journals in which we have published remains a creditable 5.05 which is good given that many surgical journals have relatively low impact factors. An interesting metric that we have reported on in the past few years is the CIF ratio or citations to impact factor ratio. Generally speaking if the CIF ratio of a paper is 1 then the paper is being cited as many times


as would be expected for that journal. The publications from the department have however had an


average CIF score of close to 10 with 90% of papers exceeding the expected citation rate for their journal of publication.

of major successes this year. The publication of the GlobalSurg 3 trial in the Lancet at the end of 2020 (online) beginning of 2021 (in print) is something that we should all celebrate. The trial was launched at an event attended by the Princess Royal in 2018 at the University and recruited an astonishing @16,000 patients in 8 months. This paper looked at disparities in provision of healthcare






and outcomes for 3 different cancers in a global context and has achieved the highest altmetric score of all the non-Covid publications. Recognition for Stephen Knight Ewen Harrison and the rest of the team came through the award of the Professor Fearon Medal for the best published paper in 2020 at this year's School of Surgery Day.

It was great to see the much-awaited TWIST trial from Kenny McLean published in Nature Digital Medicine which was a team effort form the Royal Infirmary and Western General surgical teams to explore the use of Smart phone technology in tracking wound infection.

COVID related publications from members of the Surgical Informatics group have also featured in the Lancet (3), BMJ, Lancet Respiratory Medicine (5) and have created stratospheric



downloads and altmetric scores reflecting the global thirst for good quality data on the pandemic.

Edinburgh Surgery Online: A Scholarship Success Story

Since 2007, Edinburgh Surgery Online (ESO) has been innovating and widening access to surgical education through fully and partially funded scholarships for surgical trainees.

Part-time, online Masters degrees allow students to study in their home country without having to take a dedicated break in clinical training. Delivery is modular and flexible - adding value to surgical training globally, but particularly in those countries where working hours have been reduced or specialist educational support is limited.

From an initial UK base, 375 training surgeons from more than 38 countries have now benefited from financial support to study with us and our student cohorts have become truly global. We now count 175 scholarship recipients amongst our alumni, with a further 200 currently enrolled supported by one of scholarship schemes.

Applications and awards have been increasing year-on-year with 2022 being no exception; this year we received well over 100 eligible applications and are delighted to have been able to offer 73 of these applicants fully funded scholarships for entry to the University in September 2022.

As the demand for surgical education in LMICs has expanded, we have worked to secure additional external funding to widen access, specifically to support education and capacity building in some of the world's poorest countries.
