My background is in academic scientific research; I graduated from the University of Edinburgh with a BSc in Biological Sciences (Pharmacology). After graduating I joined Astra-Zeneca near Manchester for a year before returning to Edinburgh to complete a Wellcome Trust funded MSc and PhD programme as part of the Cardiovascular Research Initiative. After completing my PhD I joined Professor David Newby's combined clinical and basic science research group as a Post-Doctoral Research Fellow studying the atherothrombotic effects of air pollution. During this time I also spent a year at the University of Queensland, Australia as a visiting Research Fellow.

My new role in the Department of Clinical Surgery will be to support the research activities of department, including assisting the students undertaking research projects as part of the Surgical Sciences distance learning courses.

I hope you enjoy reading the first edition of the new research eBulletin for Clinical Surgery.
