Edinburgh Surgery Online & RCSEd Launch New MSc in Patient Safety

September 2018 sees the first cohort of students enroll on the new MSc in Patient Safety and Clinical Human Factors - the latest in the suite of awarding winning online distance learning degree programmes offered by Edinburgh Surgery Online in partnership with the Royal College of Surgeons (Edinburgh).

Paterson-Brown and Academic e-Faciliator, Dr Domenica Coxon, the new MSc is a 3yr, part-time online degree programme supporting graduates from all health care professionals. The new degree is proving popular already, with

25 students enrolled for the inaugural year under the year 1 Directorship of Visiting Professor. **Tom Weiser.**

The programme will enable healthcare professionals not only to become advocates of patient safety but experts and future leaders in the field. Complimenting workplace experience and training, the course will be delivered thorough clinical case scenarios of common adverse events, interactive discussion forums and a dissertation on quality improvement

Structured in a similar way to Edinburgh Surgery Online's flagship programme, the MSc in Surgical Sciences, students accumulate credits through a series of modules leading to a Postgraduate Certificate (PGCert), Diploma

(PGDip) or Masters qualification.

Certificate (Year 1) will offer a broad introduction into the current state of safety in health care, how harm can come to patients and a detailed understanding of clinical human factors.

Diploma (Year 2) will examine how safety

in healthcare can be improved, for example, how good team work influences patient outcomes and how healthcare and medicine management can be improved. This year will also focus on quality improvement

research and methodologies.

MSc (Year 3) offers students the opportunity to plan, develop and execute an independent dissertation involving a research or quality improvement project of their choosing. Fully supported by a supervisor local to them, students will develop skills in original research or quality improvement methodology though a series of milestone submissions culminating in the production of a final dissertation for the MSc degree.

The unique, completely online nature of the programme enables students to access high quality education resources and to communicate with experts in the field without having to commit to attending on campus teaching in fixed sessions. The virtual learning environment facilitates a supportive online community with fellow students and tutors, allowing healthcare professionals the opportunity to undertake postgraduate study without having to take a prolong break from their professional commitments.

Currently Recruiting

The **OPTIMISE II** Trial

A large-scale, pragmatic, international, multi-centre study aiming to recruit >2500 patients globally, and seeking to provide definitive evidence on the value of a cardiac-output guided fluid and inotrope protocol in preventing infectious complications for patients >65 years of age.

This NIHR Portfolio study is sponsored by Queen Mary University of London, and the local PI is Dr Mort Kelleher (Consultant Anaesthetist). We are particularly targetting patients undergoing Whipple's procedure and gastrectomy at RIE, although patients undergoing other procedures involving the luminal GI tract may also be eligible.

The **ROMIO** Trial

A multicentre randomised controlled trial comparing minimally invasive verses open esophagectomy for esophageal cancer.

This trial is being run by the University of Bristol. NHS Lothian is open as a trial site and recruitment has begun.

OCCAMS—Oesophageal Cancer Clinical and Molecular Stratification.

A Multicentre Study to Determine Predictive and Prognostic Biomarkers and Therapeutic Targets for Oesophageal and Junctional Adenocarcinoma including Whole Genome Sequencing

The NeoAegis Trial

A phase III, open-labelled RCT comparing the MAGIC neoadjuvant/adjuvant chemotherapy regimen with the CROSS neoadjuvant chemoradiation protocol in patients with cT2-3 NO-3 MO adenocarcinoma of the oesophagus

or junction. The primary objective is to evaluate 1, 2 and 3-year survival.

TWIST—Tracking Wound Infection with Smart Phone Technology

A randomised controlled trial to investigate if a smartphone tool can shorten time to diagnosis of surgical site infections.

All patients (>16) undergoing abdominal surgery who own a smartphone are eligible to enter the study. Visually impaired patients are excluded.

Patients will be randomised to receive either standard post-operative care or standard post-operative care plus use of the smartphone tool.

Those in the smartphone group will receive a series of questions via text message and have the facility to upload a photograph of their surgical wound.

Primary outcome measure is time to diagnosis of an SSI and secondary outcome measures will consider use of A&E and GP services

RIE and WGH sites are both recruiting patients to this study.

The HOT-2 Trial

HOT-2 is a blinded randomized controlled investigation into the efficacy of heme arginate in improving primary graft function in deceased donor kidney transplantation. Professor Lorna Marson is the Chief Investigator and Edinburgh will be the lead centre for this multicentre trial

It is anticipated that Edinburgh will open as the first trial site and begin recruitment late in early 2018.

This year's guest speaker is **Professor Gordon**



Lawrence Carlson. Consultant General and Colorectal Surgeon at Salford Royal NHS Trust. Professor Carlson's undergraduate training in Manchester, was followed by Higher Surgical training in Newcastle. As well as an

honorary professorship of Surgery in Manchester, Prof Carlson has an international reputation for clinical excellence in colorectal surgery and has held visiting Professorships at several major North American and Canadian Medical Schools as well as the Karolinska Hospital, Stockholm, and Linkoping and Helsingborg Hospitals, Sweden, where he has been invited to operate on patients with complex bowel problems.

Prof Carlson has a broad colorectal and general surgical practice which includes management of anal problems, colonoscopy and colonic surgery for benign and malignant disease and abdominal wall hernias.

Academic Medals

In addition to the *The Chiene Medal* for Basic Science research and *The Ian B Macleod Medal* for Clinical Research, a new medal will be awarded at this years School of Surgery; *The Professor Kenneth Fearon Memorial Medal*.

The new prize will be awarded to the surgeon in training (or consultant within 1 year of appointment) and working in South East Scotland, who in the opinion of the judging panel has published the most outstanding contribution as a single paper in the broad field of surgery in a peer-reviewed journal. It is anticipated that the nominee will be the first author of the publication or will have made a very significant contribution to the publication.

Papers should be published in the year preceding the award; for the 2018 award, must have been published between 1st January 2017 and 31st December 2017.

Candidates should nominate themselves via an application form available from Susan Keggie (s.Keggie@ed.ac.uk) with a supporting letter from their research supervisor, the senior author or the Head of Department where the research was carried out.
